Dear NCPH Member,

I am writing to inform you that NCPH's co-publisher of *The Public Historian*, University of California Press, has partnered with JSTOR in a new initiative called the Current Scholarship Program. Beginning January 1, 2011, UC Press's journals will migrate to JSTOR as their primary online platform. You are receiving this email because *The Public Historian* will be moving from Caliber to the JSTOR platform, [www.jstor.org](http://www.jstor.org).

As part of this migration, you will need to create a MyJSTOR account on the JSTOR website in order to access your electronic subscription from January 12, 2011 onwards. Please note that your log-in details and any personalization settings on Caliber will not migrate to JSTOR. On January 12, you will receive a welcome email from JSTOR (from [support@jstor.org](mailto:support@jstor.org)) with information on creating an account and accessing your subscription.

When you receive your email from JSTOR, you will simply need to click on the link within the email and either register for a MyJSTOR account, or log in with your existing MyJSTOR account. With your MyJSTOR account, you will be able to access your subscribed content; register for Table of Contents (TOC) alerts; save, email and export citations; and register for email alerts when new content matches your saved search terms.

You should continue accessing your electronic subscription via Caliber until January 12, 2011. Please stay tuned for an email from [support@jstor.org](mailto:support@jstor.org) on January 12 with information on continuing access to your subscription via the JSTOR website.
