

**Public History Educator Assistant Professor
University of Cincinnati**

The Department of History at the University of Cincinnati invites applications for an educator assistant professor specializing in United States history and public history, to start August 15, 2012. The educator position is a renewable three-year, non-tenure appointment with the possibility of promotion through the educator ranks. Duties will include teaching graduate and undergraduate courses in American and public history, including the United States survey courses, as well as substantial program service, in particular work as director of our internship program and as the lead writer of applications for local, state, and national grants from private and public grant organizations. Teaching load is 3-2 under a semester system in conjunction with service as director of public history internships and outreach. Ph.D. in United States history with graduate work and/or professional work experience in public history required. Special consideration will be given to candidates familiar with the greater Cincinnati area, its history and public history institutions.

The University of Cincinnati is an urban, public university with an enrollment of over 42,500 students. The History Department is home to 23 full-time faculty and offers B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees.

Applicants should submit a cover letter, CV, and a professional portfolio (to include evidence of teaching excellence and collaborative public history teaching, sample course syllabi, evidence of public history work, and evidence of research or publication on local and public history topics) to the University's electronic application system at www.jobsatuc.com/applicants/Central?quickFind=81131.

Ph.D. by July 31, 2012 is required.
