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Program Description: Established in 1987, Ball State's Public History Program is among the nation's oldest undergraduate programs. It has 25-30 majors enrolled & 5 to 7 graduates annually. Students earn 33 credits in History, the majority of these in upper-level courses, including Research Methods & Historiography (required); Digital History, Oral History, and Applied Museology (electives). Nine to 12 credits are earned in the capstone course: a full-time, semester-long internship in a professional setting.
