Program Description: The Heritage Preservation Program at Georgia State University was founded in 1983 and expanded to include public history in 2001. Located in the history department, the program offers an MA in Heritage Preservation, with individual tracks in public history or historic preservation. In addition to the MA in Heritage Preservation, the history department offers a PhD in Public History and public history as a minor field for the history MA or PhD. Approximately 25 students are admitted annually. Course requirements are interdisciplinary and include training in museum studies, US and world history, archives, education and interpretation and cultural resource management.
