Program Description: Established in 1975 as the Applied History Program, the Public History Program at the University of South Carolina admits six to eight graduate students each year. The program offers an M.A. in Public History with a concentration in either historic preservation or museum studies. Students in the history Ph.D. program may select public history, historic preservation, or museum studies as one of their fields of study. At any one time, there are about fifteen Ph.D. students who have declared public history as one of their fields. In addition, students have the choice of two graduate certificate programs: the "Certificate in Museum Management" and the "Certificate in Historical Archaeology & Cultural Resource Management," as well as the dual-degree Joint Program with the School of Library and Information Science. Over 200 students have graduated from the program since 1975, with a current average of eight graduating annually.
