- **History and Social Justice**: Research that highlights the intersection of historical scholarship with issues of equity, inclusion, and social justice.
- **Original Scholarship:** Research completed in undergraduate, graduate, or independent study that strives to articulate its wider historiographical and real world significance.

- Abstract (250-300 words)
