The US Federal Government is in the midst of dramatic and rapid changes. The full extent and duration of these changes remains unclear, but what is already clear is that there are and will continue to be significant impacts on the practice and funding of public history. Join us for an open discussion of how these changes are affecting various public history workplaces, initiatives, and projects and what sorts of plans and strategies professionals are adopting in response. In the wake of the phenomenon that is *Bridgerton* and the impact of *Hamilton: The Musical*, there has been growing conversation surrounding casting choices within historical fiction and period dramas on television and in movies; with an increase of both criticism and praise for casting people of color as actual historical figures or placing them in historical spaces where they may not have been in the traditional narrative. With this discussion, we'll explore the potential reasons why this might be happening, what positive and negative impacts it might have on public perception of history, whether or not it is achieving in increasing representation of marginalized peoples, and ways in which creators and artists can balance historical accuracy while maintaining creative license.
