# **Dear House Appropriators,**

We, the undersigned organizations dedicated to the perpetuation of great American places, write to urge your strong support for federal programs and staff essential to the protection and preservation of the United States' rich cultural and historic heritage. The Historic Preservation Fund (HPF) and the federal preservation professionals who steward it are vital to ensuring that our shared national story—including the diverse histories of Indigenous communities, communities of color, disabled people, LGBTQ+ people, women, territories, rural and urban areas alike—is preserved for future generations.

For nearly five decades, the Historic Preservation Fund has served as the cornerstone of our national preservation framework. It provides critical funding to State and Tribal Historic Preservation Offices, local governments, and nonprofits engaged in rigorously documenting, protecting, and revitalizing historic places across the country. This critical investment drives economic development, supports good-paying jobs, promotes sustainability, and strengthens community identity and security.

Equally vital are agency budget allocations for the federal staff who administer preservation programs at the National Park Service and other agencies. These professionals offer technical assistance, review projects for compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act, and help communities navigate complex preservation processes. Their expertise ensures that federal preservation goals are met efficiently and transparently.

Yet, Historic Preservation Fund programs and cultural preservation personnel are persistently underfunded and overstretched. In recent years, the Historic Preservation Fund received a fraction of what is needed to meet the growing demand for preservation work across the nation. Moreover, the federal workforce dedicated to preserving our national heritage continues to shrink due to program defunding, reduction in force orders, and hiring constraints, jeopardizing the integrity and effectiveness of preservation efforts.

We call on Congress to:

- Fully fund the Historic Preservation Fund.
- Ensure robust funding for staffing and support of federal preservation offices, including at the National Park Service, Bureau of Land Management, Advisory Council

on Historic Preservation, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and other key agencies.

 Safeguard the integrity of the National Historic Preservation Act and other bedrock preservation laws, ensuring they are upheld and enforced by well-supported federal personnel.

Historic preservation is a nonpartisan issue that touches every district and state. It is central to telling America's full story—recognizing both triumphs and injustices—and to building stronger, more resilient communities. We urge you to act boldly in support of these programs and the dedicated staff who drive their success.
